We hope you all enjoyed your Christmas and New Year period and stayed safe during the hectic times. Everything is back in full swing in the clinic with the trips to Karratha and Geraldton already planned and underway. This is a very special year as we celebrate our 30th birthday in independent private practice.

Batteries

When you need **new batteries** you can either pop into the clinic and pick some up or you can simply **call us** on 9388 8003 and we will **post them out to you**.

Used batteries should not be placed in your rubbish nor recycling bins at home. These batteries can be recycled but only at designated recycle points. **Batteries** can be **recycled** at any **Battery World** store, as well as many city/council buildings and libraries. A full list of businesses involved in battery recycling can be found on the 'Recycling Near You' webpage. In **Geraldton**, batteries can be recycled at the **Civic Centre**, QPT post office and Geraldton Regional Library.

If you place batteries in the rubbish or home recycling they end up in land fill which puts hazardous chemicals into the ground. This can impact the environment as the chemicals leach into soil and water systems. By recycling the batteries the metals used can be reused and hazardous chemicals will not enter the ecosystem.

Swim, Noise and Musician Plugs

Did you know that we do custom swim, noise and musician plugs? If you have grommets or perforated ear drums you should not get your ears wet. Plugs and ear wraps are recommended, this is especially important in the hot summer months and swimming to cool down. Also remember, as a general rule, that if you need to raise your voice to be heard, the noise or music is too loud and is causing irreversible damage to your hearing. Custom noise and musician plugs come with a variety of noise filtering options and will help preserve your hearing.



15 Reasons You Should Wear Two Hearing Aids

1. Keeping both ears active resulting in less hearing loss deterioration

Research shows that when only one hearing instrument is worn, the unaided ear tends to lose its ability to hear and understand. This is clinically called auditory deprivation effect. Those wearing two hearing instruments keep both ears active, keeping auditory deprivation at bay.

2. Better understanding of speech

By wearing two hearing instruments, rather than one, selective listening is more easily achieved. This means your brain can focus in the conversation you want to hear. Research shows that people wearing two hearing aids routinely understand speech and conversation significantly better than people wearing one hearing aid.

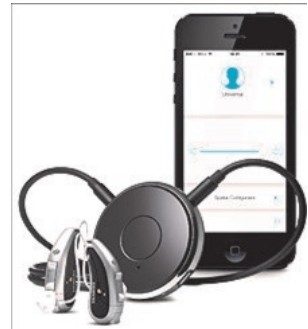
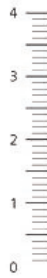

Hear Better Than Normal Hearing People*

Siemens has released new technology called Binax which simulates how normal hearing people process sound from both ears. This new technology uses a virtual 8 microphones, which provides heightened sensitivity to sounds. According to two independent studies, this allows hearing aid users to hear better app, which allow easy to use, personal than normal hearing people when in noise. Binax comes in two different levels of technology and in the discrete Receiver-In-the-Canal style. Available with this device is a streamer and smartphone control of the devices.

Insuring your hearing aids

If you have privately **purchased** your **hearing aids**, or upgraded and paid extra from those fully subsidised by the government, then it is advisable to insure your aids.

Hearings aids can be **insured in your home and contents insurance** which will provide cover if they are lost and will sometimes pay for repairs, depending on your cover.

We have heard through the grapevine, that in September someone bought some new hearing aids, not from us, and then went out on a boat the next day. They looked overboard and one of their aids fell off. How it fell off we don't know, but they didn't have them insured, so they then had to decide if they could afford another brand new aid or go without.

If you have **fully subsidised** hearing aids from the government, you **do not need to insure** them. If you lose one there is a \$30 replacement in order to provide a new aid. If you have paid extra to get better technology, this is not covered by the \$30 replacement fee.
